Re: Algola Seaweed Skin Repair Cream
Our Reference: C259 259-2013

We have reviewed your draft label for compliance with the requirements for 'cosmetics' in Australia. To meet the requirements for cosmetics a product must:

- Meet the definition of cosmetic in the Industrial Chemicals (Notification and Assessment) Act 1989;
- Not be scheduled in schedules 2, 3, 4 or 8 of the Standard for the Uniform Scheduling of Medicines and Poisons (SUSMP);
- Include only ingredients that are listed on the Australian Inventory of Chemical Substances (AICS) database or are exempt from listing on the database;
- Not include any prohibited chemicals and meet any conditions for use of restricted chemicals;
- Meet any applicable conditions of a cosmetics standard that applies to the product (if any):
- Meet the labelling requirements of the Trade Practices (Consumer Product Information Standards)(Cosmetics)Regulations 1991; and
- Be marketed as a cosmetic.

As the ingredient quantities have not been provided, we have not assessed whether the ingredients are listed in the correct order on the product label (Attachment 1). You should ensure that the ingredients are shown on the label in descending order starting with the highest content by weight or volume. Your manufacturer should be able to give you the correct order without revealing the quantities.

In our view the product, labelled as shown in Attachment 1 to this letter, meets these requirements. This product can be marketed without specific approval from the Therapeutic
